WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Through July, AUMC has been able to give 6102 hours of connection and service in the community. That is phenomenal! As I reflect two scriptures come to mind. The first from Philippians 1:3-6

³ I thank my God for every remembrance of you, ⁴ always in every one of my prayers for all of you, praying with joy ⁵ for your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now. ⁶ I am confident of this, that the one who began a good work in you will continue to complete it until the day of Jesus Christ.

And the second from Galatians 6:9

⁹ So let us not grow weary in doing what is right, for we will reap at harvest time, if we do not give up.

These are two scriptures that I remind myself of often. The first is a scripture of celebration of what has been accomplished combined with the hope that the faith community will finish their goal. Two years ago our goal was 5000 hours of service. Last year was 8,000. This year was 9,000. Each year we flew past our goal and this year is no different. We are on pace to give 10,460 hours of service this year! Like Paul, I celebrate what we have been able to do and believe with hope that we will finish 2024 strong. Part of our strategy to do so is our Mission Possible projects. We are hoping to have five projects this fall with: Kansas Food Bank, Simply Hygiene, Ember Hope, Envision, and a mission trip to Oklahoma City. Two are scheduled: Kansas Foodbank Warehouse on September 16th led by Tammy Eilert and Envision on October 12th led by Cathy Durano.

As excited as I am about these projects I am reminded of the second scripture. Goals can be great but they can also burn us out. The point of the number of service hours is to be an extra incentive to get out and serve. It can also feel like a burden. I invite you this fall to take a breath and not grow weary of doing good. Let's celebrate each moment of service in the joy and value of itself. It is a moment we get to live out our faith and that is worthy of celebration. The numbers can be exciting but the true purpose of AUMC's push for service is the connection. If you are able to give one extra moment of service and connection so somebody around you may know they are not alone, there are people that care, and in Jesus a God of Grace and Love then you have lived out your faith.

I invite us to not grow weary and continue living out our faith through service and connection this fall!

>>> UNIFIED BOARD

The Unified Board wanted to update you on one of our practices. In our meetings we have a section called "Leadership Development," where we learn something; maybe it is about a spiritual practice or maybe it is a church organizational tip. This year, we have been doing a book study over the book 8 Virtues of Rapidly Growing Churches by Matt Miofsky and Jason Byassee. What we are reading has been very encouraging as we feel AUMC already does some of the practices described in the book. It confirms our church is on the right trajectory. One strength of our congregation is it's focused on radical hospitality which includes noticing people and checking in on them. Although we could always do better in this area, it is something the unified board feels that the people who attend AUMC, purposefully do. (If you ever feel a need to be called by the pastor, please let him know by calling the church office.)

One area that the book brings up as one of the virtues of a rapidly growing church is how rapidly growing churches have a "right-hand person." We've talked a lot about that in our meetings and feel that hiring a full-time youth pastor at AUMC would help fill that need. We think this is an important issue because being the pastor of a church is a stressful job with few people who you can lean on to share the load. Of course, having someone full-time in this position would increase our budget, so that leads us to asking you to start thinking about your giving.

October will start the annual stewardship campaign. As you think about your pledge, we encourage you to look back on your life and think of how the decisions of others have positively impacted you. Did you get a scholarship to college? Then someone gave their money to that fund and it impacted your life. Were you ever in a youth group? Then someone gave money to that organization to fund those mission trips and Wednesday night activities. The same goes for our church now. We don't give just to "get back" for us and our individual families. We give for the ones who come after us, people we don't necessarily even know.

So, as fall arrives, we hope you will spend some time reflecting on how those who came before you gave for things that helped you on your journey and consider how you can help those who are coming after you.
