WORD FROM THE PASTOR

²The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness— on them light has shined.

Isaiah 9:2

This passage from Isaiah that we read every year was given in a time of looming dread. The foreign armies of Babylon were threatening the sovereignty of Israel. The prophets were seeking a word that would calm the King and give hope to the people. It is in this setting that the prophet Isaiah gives the prophecy of a child that would be king. The symbols of darkness and light grow in their strength as we approach the winter solstice where the days are shortest. In these periods of long night the imagery of light is often used for hope. Light cuts through darkness. Even the stars that are millions of miles away cut through the darkness of space.

The gospel of John also uses the imagery of light to describe Jesus:

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in him was life, and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

Jesus is our hope that breaks through whatever is going on in your life. In fact, it is the hope that begins the season. Advent, which is the beginning of the liturgical year, is all about preparing for hope. Part of the ritual of December is decorating and preparing the space for Christmas. What if that space was for more than just gifts and trees; what if you thought of it as preparing for hope. This Christmas I invite you prepare to find the light and hope in Jesus.


Dec. 2024
