WORD FROM THE PASTOR

Happy October Andover! If you have ever searched for scripture for people struggling you may have come across this from Romans:

³ And not only that, but we also boast in our afflictions, knowing that affliction produces endurance, ⁴ and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, ⁵ and hope does not put us to shame, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us.

Affliction or suffering produces endurance? I see how endurance produces character. Daily practices install a routine that strengthens our identity. If I run every day so I am a runner or I ride my bike every day so therefor I am a biker. If we have a routine that is built in faith and gratitude those become our identity. By practicing the faith, we hope to have we end up possessing this faith. Yes, it is a little more complicated and we benefit from having a faith community to help, but essentially through the endurance or discipline of practicing we build our faith. This faith or character produces hope as we experience the changes in our physical, mental, and spiritual self. Through daily practices we become the person God has called us to be.

But why does all of it need to start with affliction? Why is this good news for people struggling? First, the wrong answer is that God has caused the struggle for us to grow in our faith. This does not follow any example we have of Jesus and is detrimental for people to think God desires to let people struggle. I believe what Paul is doing in this scripture is to break the connection that God is only present when things are going well. In the passages before Paul lifts up how we praise God in all the great things that are happening. As we experience blessings from God we should tell others about the goodness God has for them. Yet, there are many people who are struggling and would have a hard time naming a blessing they have experienced. Paul is stating that even in these moments of affliction, suffering or difficulty God is present. We are not alone and even though we may be struggling we can rejoice that God is with us. It is this knowledge that can help us continue daily faith practices connecting us to God and to other people. Through the daily connection even in the most difficult times we can find hope.

If you know someone who is struggling, I invite you this month to send a message or phone call to them. Let them know you are thinking about them. If you are struggling, I want you to know that while it may be hard to see God is with you. Reach out to family, friends, a neighbor, to me. Everyone goes through struggles. Through our connection to each other and God we can find hope through it.
